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

Whale's-eye view



The just-christened new build Le Lapérouse strikes a celebratory note for French line Ponant, which marks its 30th anniversary this year.

Le Lapérouse (pictured left) is the first in Ponant's new Explorer series, with five more like it to come.

The 92 all-balcony suites Le Lapérouse features a world-first underwater lounge. Known as The Blue Eye, the lounge centrepiece (above) comprises two large portholes in the shape of "cetacean eyes".

In lieu of sea life, passengers watched the aquatic ballet of French free-diving champion Aurore Asso during the July christening in Hafnarfjörður, Iceland.

In the lounge, guests can also view live images captured by three underwater cameras attached to the ship. Hydrophones capture the symphony of the oceanic world and pipe it into the lounge, where you can feel the vibe, quite literally, through the "body listening" sofas that gently vibrate by corporal resonance.

ACCUMULATED STRESS can be hard to beat, but the soon-to-be-sailing Celebrity Edge has just the tonic. While the ship won't be ready until November, the dramatic new The Spa concept has been revealed – 2000 square metres of pure rejuvenation at sea, including a hammam, salt room, steam room, float room and infrared sauna.

"Our aspiration for The Spa is the same as for Celebrity Edge – to provide guests with a more profound connection to the sea," says Lisa Lutoff-Perlo, President, Celebrity Cruises.

In The Spa, 31 therapists will work across 124 treatment rooms with offerings such as the Ocean Spa Wave Massage.
